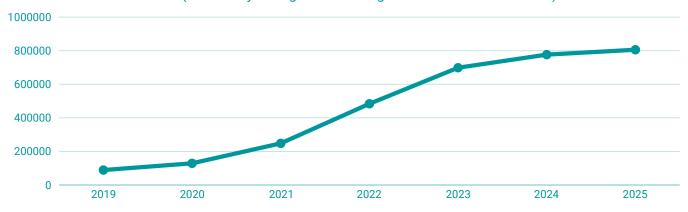
The Numbers 2025

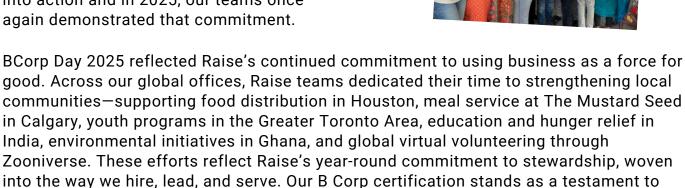

Location: Yellowknife, NT

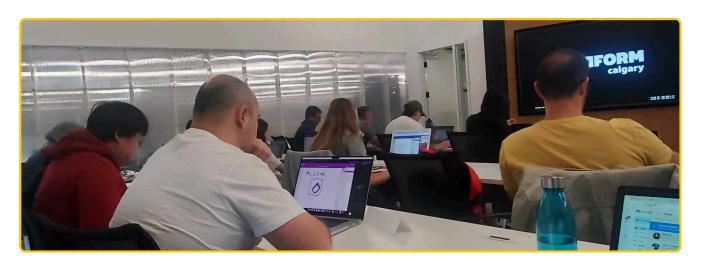

Truth and Reconciliation
